DONALD, G., *The Influence of French Symbolism on Russian Poetry*, The Hague, 1958.

A thorough and well-documented study of this subject.

ETIEMBLE, R., *Le Mythe de Rimbaud*, Paris, 1952-61

This is a vast study in four volumes of which the final one seems unlikely to appear. Vol. I, *La Genèse du Mythe* is a huge bibliography listing the thousands of books and articles that built up, and are still building up, the Rimbaud legend. Vol. II, *La Structure du Mythe* outlines briefly the various theories that have been advanced to 'explain' Rimbaud — 'Rimbaud the Child'. 'Rimbaud the Seer'.

FAIRLIE, ALISON, *Les Fleurs du Mal*, London, 1960.

A short but useful study in a series published by Edward Arnold aimed at offering a sound introduction to well-known works.
